
The GM Skin Cancer Pathway Board has adopted a multipronged approach to education.

Sun Awareness Week

- Over 900 views on Facebook and over 300 on Twitter.



Education for Primary Care

- Gateway C webinar supporting earlier & faster skin cancer diagnosis
- Provision of dermatoscopes to aid early diagnosis with a Dermoscopy study day for all GPs in GM (over 280 GPs in attendance face to face or online)
- Gateway C videos to support dermoscopy education
- Pathway board members taught on the DECIDE GP education program





Education for schools

Pilot of NICE recognised (Skcin) 'Sun Safe Schools' education resource in an Early Years Foundation Setting and a Primary School in Greater Manchester with increased sun safe behaviours evidenced
