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## **Background and Context**

By 2028, **75% of people with Cancer will be diagnosed at an early stage** (stage 1 or 2). Earlier and faster diagnosis of cancer is dependent on identifying and employing a range of interventions

### **Primary Care Network Engagement- Cancer Leads**

Primary Care Networks (PCNs) are guided by the Direct Enhanced Service (DES) contract and are crucial to improving earlier cancer diagnosis. To support delivery of the DES and to implement early diagnosis interventions, we established a named Cancer Lead in each of the 66 PCNs in GM and communicate via monthly meetings and bulletins. Supported by their detailed knowledge of the communities they work in, we have successfully increased the uptake of FIT in Primary Care, provided PCNs with information in a range of formats and languages and enabled patient facing information to be shared via the Practice websites.
