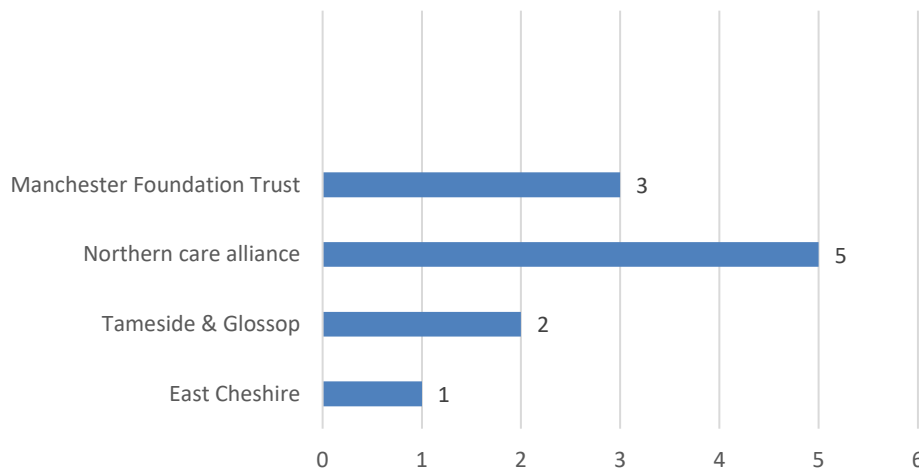


How many years have you worked in an imaging role?

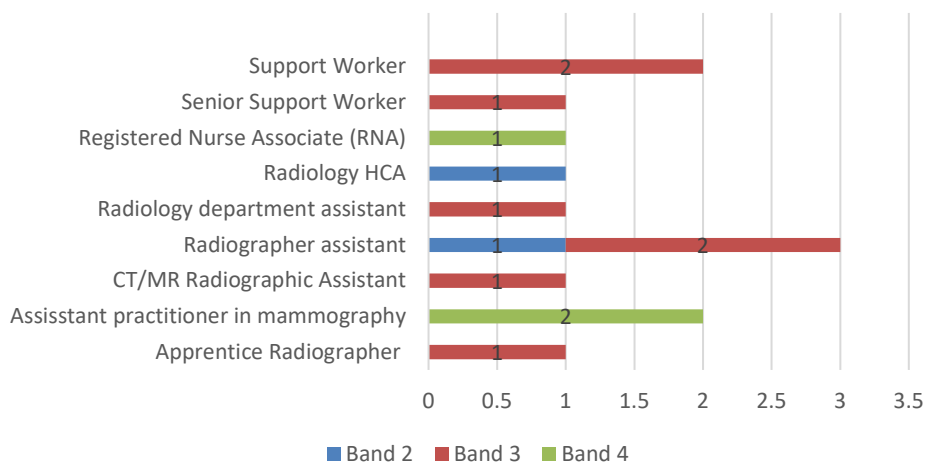

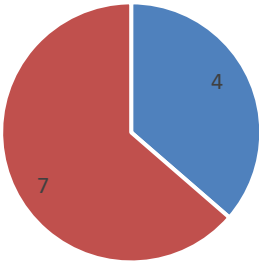

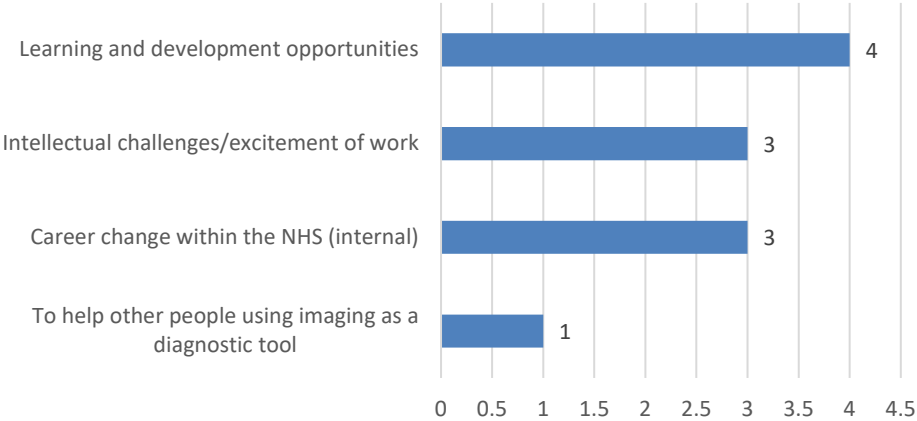

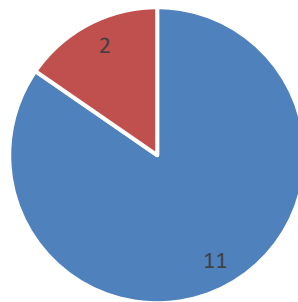

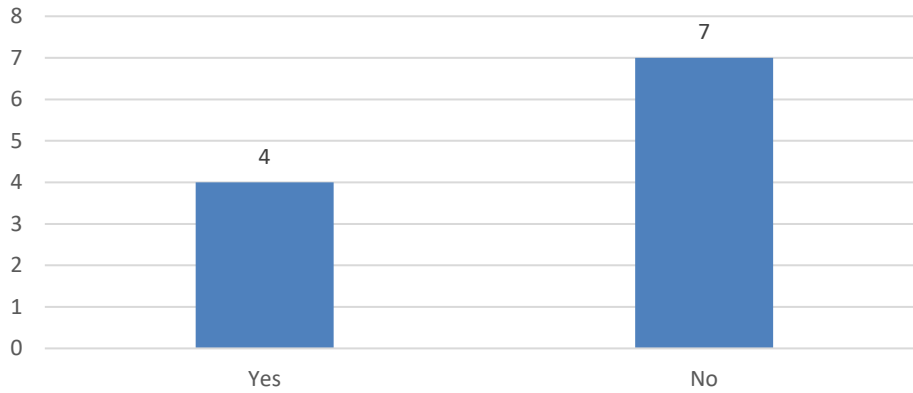

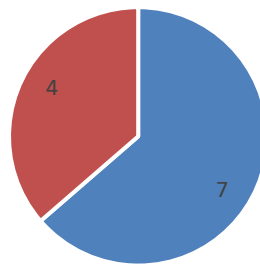
What factors do you consider being the most important influence in your career?

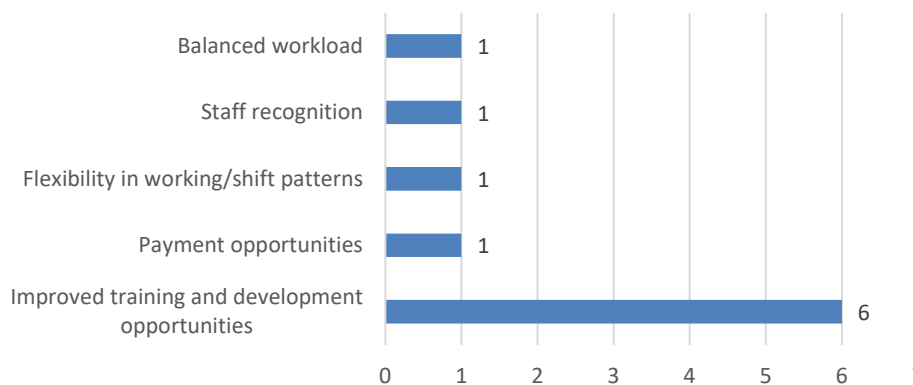

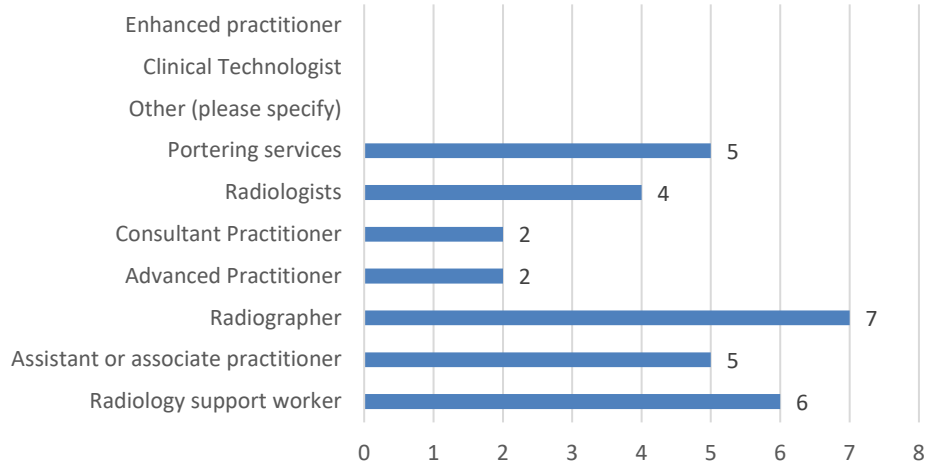

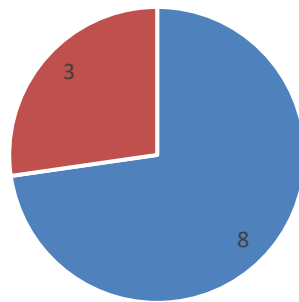
