


Your **GP** has asked an **expert doctor** called a **consultant** to see you **as soon as possible.**



The consultant will look into your health problem and find out the cause.



There are many reasons why you could be having this health problem.



Your health problem might not be serious but it is important to look into it quickly because it could be to check if it is cancer.



You should get an **appointment** with a consultant within two weeks.



Your appointment could be **at the hospital**








a **telephone** or **video** appointment.



If your **first appointment** is on the **telephone** you might be called from an **unknown number.**

Please answer the call.



Your **GP has asked** you to be seen by a consultant because your health problems could be **cancer.**



Nine out of ten people who have these appointments find out that their health problem is **not** cancer.



It is **important** that your health problem is **looked into straight away** so that you can:



 find out the cause of your health problem



• begin the right **treatment** as soon as possible.



The **hospital** will **contact you** in the **next few days** to **set up** your appointment.



If you have not been contacted by the hospital within one week please tell your **GP surgery**.



You will find out more information about the next steps when you have your appointment.



The **consultant** might need to **set up tests** in the hospital to **find out** what is **causing** your health problem.



You **might** need to have:

- Blood tests
- an MRI scan or CT scan
- Camera tests.



If you need a **scan** or **camera test** we will get in touch before the appointment.



Please **follow any instructions** given to you **about the test.**

Please let us know if you need the **instructions** in Easy Read or another format.



It is **very important** that you **go to the appointment.**



You may wish to bring a friend or family member with you.



This may be helpful if you have any questions when you talk to the medical team.



If you have any worries or questions about your referral, please contact your GP.
