Late Effects of Cancer


There are currently 2.5 million people living with cancer in the UK however this is set to rise to 4 million by 2030.

This means more people are living with the disease, its side effects and the consequences of its treatment for many years. This also impacts the system as there are very few dedicated services to support patients with the large variety of symptoms they can have.

The Personalised Care team is setting up a Late Effects Delivery Group to improve delivery of late effects services in GM. Initially this group will work to map the service need across the area and develop plans and pathways to ensure equity of access to good quality support.

Working with the Cancer Academy team, we will develop a range of educational resources for GPs to help them recognise and treat Late Effects in primary care. The first of these will be a webinar in January, the topic will be decided based on the feedback from our education survey which can be completed by primary care staff via <u>this link</u> or the QR code below.

ORCHA Digital Health Platform

The Personalised Care Programme will be supporting the development of a Greater Manchester ORCHA digital health platform for our patients and carers. ORCHA is a web based searchable library of digital patient apps that go through robust clinical validation to ensure we are offering advice and support that can be trusted. We plan to use information provided by holistic needs assessments completed in Trusts across GM and the Quality of Life survey results to ensure the apps available are targeted towards what our patients' non-clinical needs are and we will be able to monitor the interaction and use of this platform.

There will be a drop in session on the 27th November 10.30-11.30 where you can come along and be shown a demonstration of the digital health platform and ask questions of the ORCHA team.

InfoFlex rollout to support Personalised Stratified Follow Up (PSFU)

The Personalised care team has been working tirelessly with Trusts to implement a standardised digital system to support the roll out of PSFU. After the successful implementation of Infoflex at Tameside, Salford (NCA) and Bury, Rochdale and Oldham (NCA), the project continues at pace to rollout to The Christie, Bolton, Stockport and Wigan Wrightington and Leigh by the end of March 2024. This will support Trusts to meet the national requirement to implement PSFU in colorectal, breast, endometrial and Prostate
