Standardising Clinical Nurse Specialist Job Descriptions

The team have been working with the Lead Cancer Nurses to collate job descriptions for Band 6 and 7 Clinical Nurse Specialists from all organisations with the aim to standardise across Greater Manchester.

We have an initial draft that is currently under review by the group and hope to provide finalised job descriptions in early March. As part of this review process, we will be working with Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion colleagues to ensure the standardised format meets inclusive language and health literacy best practice.

Communication Skills Training Pilot

The Academy is pleased to announce the release of the Communication Skills Training Package pilot, created in collaboration with Recourse:AI.

This cutting-edge training package is the first of its kind to deliver Communication Skills Training through the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI).



The package will transform the way people access communication skills training by creating Al-driven experiential education.

Users will be able to immerse themselves in interactive scenarios involving patients and carers, practicing skills in delivering difficult news, conflict management, and de-escalation within a secure and controlled environment.

The pilot will be available in February to Healthcare Professionals across Greater Manchester with a robust evaluation process in place.

The Late Effects of Cancer and its Treatment for Primary Care Professionals Webinar

Role of the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) in Senior Adult Oncology Services 7th March 2024, 12:00-14:00

As the population ages, existing geriatric services both in primary and secondary care are already overstretched. Referrals to such services could have an impact in delaying cancer treatment in older cancer patients living with frailty or multimorbidities.

This webinar will explore the roles of the MDT such as nurses and allied health professionals in providing Comprehensive Geriatric Assessments for older adults with cancer.

Academy Highlights

Gynaecological Skills Lab

Last week, the Academy delivered its first Vaginal Examination Skills Lab for primary care professionals.

The session was run by a trained facilitator and taught topics on examination basics and smear taking, allowing the delegates to look for and feel cancers using pelvic models.



Colorectal & Skin Cancer Event

Last week, the Academy delivered two educational events to Healthcare Professionals from across Greater Manchester. The Colorectal Stakeholder Event was a whole system event focused on uplifting the quality of bowel cancer care and improving patient experience. 150 delegates attended from across Greater Manchester and benefitted from a jam-packed agenda focusing on a variety of colorectal 'hot topics'.

The Skin Cancer Education Event took place on Thursday 8th February. 80 delegates came together to network, share best practice and hear about the ongoing developments via the Greater Manchester Skin Cancer Pathway Board. The agenda focused on various areas of practice including current challenges in pathology, advances in skin cancer surgery and personalised care.

Research Scoping

Greater Manchester Cancer Alliance have agreed on a set of research principles to better support patient-facing professionals and their knowledge of the current clinical research trials that are available to patients. Professionals should have access to up-to-date resources and educational materials so that they can effectively communicate opportunities across specialties to patients.
