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What is National Cancer CNS Day?

National Cancer Clinical Nurse Specialist Day is a social media awareness day that has been developed to highlight and celebrate the hugely important role that the cancer nursing workforce provides in support of patients and UK-wide health systems on a daily basis. The event takes place annually on the 15th March across all 4 nations and is celebrated nationally. GM Cancer were proud to co-lead the day alongside UKONS and Macmillan, with the ongoing support from NHS England and the RCN.

The idea for a national cancer CNS day was developed from the knowledge that the growth of the cancer workforce is not keeping pace with the increasing demand for cancer services. The Cancer CNS workforce is aging; 18% of the workforce are older than the general nursing personnel. Furthermore, 30% of CNSs are looking to retire in the next 8 years. Which means campaigns such as the National Cancer CNS Day are vital.
