Personalised Care



Digital remote monitoring system (dRMS) connecting 40 different interfaces across all Greater Manchester Trusts



Almost 3,800 patients being tracked via personalised stratified follow up (PSFU)



Funded two clinical posts for Greater Manchester Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust (GMMH) via "Think Well with Cancer" project



Created eight animations to support health and wellbeing during cancer treatment

Early Diagnosis



60.2% of cancers diagnosed at stage 1 or 2 (taking Greater Manchester above the England average for the first time)



Faecal Immunochemical Test (FIT) – achieved of the **80% IIF standard** by December 2024



778 lung cancers detected via TLHC, with 80% of these diagnosed at an early stage

Operational performance and treatment variation



Over 80% achieved against target of 77% for Faster Diagnosis Standard (FDS)

Delivery of the 70% interim target for the 62 day referral to treatment (RTT) standard



Tele-derm is across all 5 sites delivering suspected skin cancer diagnosis services



Two new pathways implemented – HRT for post-menopausal bleeding, and mastalgia



CAN-STOP (survival, treatment and optimisation programme) model – lung complex treatment pathway improved by 15 days and 10% increase in 12 month survival. Roll out programme commenced



19,000+ pathway days

saved with the single queue diagnostics (SQD) programme and expansion continues
