Is the service primarily set up for patients with cancer?	No. This is a hospice but they work with people (and their family) suffering from life limiting illness (e.g. cancer)
Age of client groups (Adults of children):	Adults 18+. Children aged 5-18 who are family members to the patients with life limiting illness, we



	can offer pre-bereavement work with children but often the work is post-bereavement.
Key inclusion/Exclusion criteria:	Mainly for people from Tameside & Glossop, but sometimes they accept people from outside the area
PCTS served/ Catchment Area:	People living in Tameside and Glossop or who have a GP in Tameside and Glossop
Name of Interventions (Individual or Group):	Individual counselling for patients who have a life-limiting illness and their family or close relatives/ carers. Counselling for carers can be in the pre and post bereavement stages. 6 week Sunflower group for children 3 times per year, 2 bereavement groups for adults per year (the growing grief group) and also a dementia carers group that runs twice a year- all therapeutic groups are facilitated by Counsellors.

Statutory of non-statutory?	Charity based, received 24% of funding from government


