Tick off your cervical screening

Cervical screening (it used to be called a 'smear test') is a test that checks the health of your cervix and can help prevent cervical cancer. All women and people with a cervix aged 25 to 64 are invited for cervical screening every 5 years.

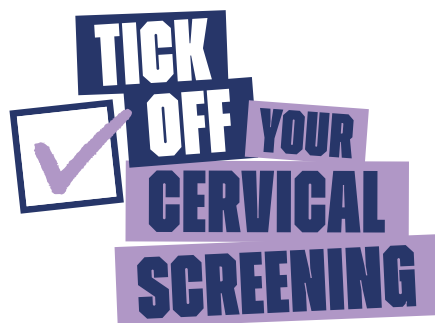
What does it involve?

Cervical screening involves taking a small sample of cells from your cervix for testing. It's usually done by a female nurse or doctor, who will explain the test and answer any questions before they start.

If you experience any unusual symptoms such as pain during sex, irregular bleeding, discharge or symptoms that you are worried about, make sure you see a GP, even if you've recently had your cervical cancer screening test. Do not wait for your cervical screening appointment.
